Directions: Write a complete answer in response to **all** of the following questions. See below for further instructions.

- 1. What is the difference between reasonable suspicion and probable cause? How is reasonableness determined? You will need a detailed discussion of these questions with citations to cases *that you have read*.
- 2. Name four exceptions to the search warrant requirement and discuss each one by providing an example of the application of the exception to particular facts. These examples should come from cases that you have read.
- 3. When does the Sixth Amendment right to counsel exist? How is that right different from the Fifth Amendment right to counsel?

- 3. Do not paste the question in your response to take up space. Just number your answers so I know which question you are answering.
- 4. If your only resource is the text, you will not be happy with your grade. You must do independent research and read cases. If you are stuck and do not know how to look up an answer, contact me and I will post helpful hints on desksgt.com .
- 4. We study criminology to learn to use empirical evidence to answer criminal justice questions. If you answer questions with just uninformed opinions, you will receive no credit for that answer. Do your research, follow the research, summarize the research, and use the research to answer the questions.
